SCULPTURE MATERIALS

Here are some ideas to explore at home:

Wire	Paper Plates or Paper Cups
Wire with Stocking Stretched over it	Masking Tape

Corrugated Card	sculptor Andy Goldsworthy!)
Recycled Materials	Tin
 E.g. plastic bottles, cardboard rolls, egg	Copper
